C I R C U L A R

SUBJECT: Minimum tenure of officers appointed as Chief Vigilance Officers – not to be transferred before two years.

The State Government has recently appointed Chief Vigilance Officers in various Departments of the State Government as well as in the various Corporations / Companies / Boards & other autonomous organisations under the State Government. The nature of the duties which are expected to be carried out by the Chief Vigilance Officers are such that these can be performed effectively by the Chief Vigilance Officers only if they continue in the concerned Department / Organisation for a certain minimum length of time. With a view to ensuring that the Chief Vigilance Officers are able to work effectively, the State Government has decided that the officers who have been appointed as Chief Vigilance Officers should not be transferred for at least two years after they have been so appointed by the Chief Vigilance Commissioner.


All Principal Secretaries to Government / Secretaries to Government / Heads of Departments are hereby directed to

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ensure that in future no officer who has been appointed as a Chief Vigilance Officer by the Chief Vigilance Commissioner is transferred before he has completed at least two years after having been appointed as Chief Vigilance Officer.

If on account of any extraordinary circumstances any of the officers appointed as Chief Vigilance Officers are required to be transferred before two years, the concerned Department should make a reference to the Chief Vigilance Commissioner and seek his prior approval. It may be noted that no Chief Vigilance Officer shall be transferred by the concerned Departments before two years except after obtaining the prior approval of the Chief Vigilance Commissioner.

All concerned are requested to kindly note the above-mentioned directions and to ensure strict compliance thereof. Any violation of these instructions shall be viewed very seriously by the State Government and shall invite disciplinary action against the defaulting officers.
