Subject:-Online Singapore Cooperation Programme on "Assuring Food Safety and Security" from 4th to 8th July, 2022.

The Republic of Singapore has invited nominations for <u>online</u> course on "Assuring Food Safety and Security" from 4th to 8th July, 2022 under the Technical Assistance Programme with India. The programme is intended for Midto Senior-level government officials involved in food safety and/or security policies. The eligibility conditions and other information about the course are mentioned in the Information Brochure received from the sponsoring Government (Annex-I). Number of slots available for India is One.

Singapore Cooperation Programme

Singapore has provided technical assistance to other developing countries since the 1960s. As a country whose only resource is its people, Singapore believes that human resource development is vital for economic and social progress. Singapore itself has benefited from training provided by other countries and international organisations.

In 1992, the Singapore Cooperation Programme (SCP) was established to bring together under one framework the various technical assistance programmes offered by Singapore. Through the SCP, the range and number of training programmes were increased to share Singapore's development experience with other developing countries.

To date, over 137,000 officials from more than 180 countries, territories and intergovernmental organisations have participated in our courses and study visits. The SCP is managed by the Technical Cooperation Directorate of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, Singapore.

Singapore Food Agency

The Singapore Food Agency (SFA) was formed as a statutory board under the Ministry of the Environment and Water Resources (MEWR) on 1 April 2019 to oversee food safety and food security from farm-to-fork. MEWR has been renamed as the Ministry of Sustainability and the Environment (MSE). The SFA brings together food-related functions carried out by the former Agri-Food & Veterinary Authority of Singapore, the National Environment Agency and the Health Sciences Authority.

As the lead agency for food-related matters, SFA's mission is to ensure and secure a supply of safe food for Singapore. SFA works hand-in-hand with the industry and consumers to grow our three "food baskets" — Diversify import sources, Grow local, and Grow overseas, as well as ensure food safety from farm-to-fork. SFA also partners food businesses to strengthen capabilities, tap on technologies to raise productivity, undertake research to develop new lines of business, and catalyse industry transformation to ensure food security.

Course Objectives

This online course is conducted under the auspices of the SCP Training Award.

The course will will share about Singapore's national food control system and strategies to improve food safety and security.

Synopsis

Topics to be covered include:

- Food safety policy and legal framework;
- · Risk-based food inspection system;
- Food safety testing capabilities, chemical and microbiological risk analysis;
- Ensuring safety of locally produced and processed food; and
- Strategic and initiatives in ensuring good security.



Methodology

This course will be delivered for up to <u>30 participants</u> through synchronous e-Learning ('live' e-learning sessions), and could include asynchronous e-Learning (self-study e.g. reading materials). There will be Q&A sessions and facilitated group discussions during the 'live' e-learning sessions.

Regulations

Participants are required to comply with the following:

- Strictly observe course schedules and not miss training sessions; and
- Carry out instructions and abide by conditions as may be stipulated by the nominating Authority or Government and the Government of Singapore and its appointed trainer, with respect to the course.

Duration

The course will be held over five days from <u>04 to 08 July 2022</u>.

The 'live' e-learning sessions will be <u>tentatively</u> conducted from 1400H to 1800H (Singapore time; <u>UTC/GMT +08:00 hours</u>) daily. More details on the programme schedule will be provided to successful applicants closer to the start of course.

Attendance will be taken for the 'live' e-learning sessions.

Application Information

Applicants should be:

- Mid- to senior-level government officials involved in officials involved in food safety and/or security policies;
- Able to attend <u>all</u> the synchronous e-learning sessions. They will require an internet-enabled device with a functioning webcam, microphone and audio;
- Nominated by their respective Governments; and
- Proficient in written and spoken English.

Terms of Award

The course is sponsored by the Government of Singapore under the Singapore Cooperation Programme Training Award.

Application Procedure

(Closing date for nomination: 06 June 2022)

The Government of Singapore is pleased to invite the respective National Focal Point for Technical Assistance (NFP) to nominate 1 suitable applicant. Selection of candidates will be based on merit. Should there be more applicants than training places, the Government of Singapore seeks the understanding of the respective NFP in the event that its nominee(s) is not selected.

SUMMARY OF GUIDELINES PRESCRIBED BY DEPARTMENT OF ECONOMIC AFFAIRS

Before applying for the training programme, the candidates are requested to satisfy themselves whether they fulfill the eligibility conditions as per the guidelines on Foreign Training Programmes (FTP) administered by the Department of Economic Affairs (DEA), summarized below:

Note: Project-related training/official visits abroad are exempt from the provision of cooling off.

Candidates and nominating authorities in Ministries/Departments/State Govts. etc. should also satisfy
themselves about the eligibility conditions prescribed by the sponsoring foreign Government/agency before
sending the nominations to DEA.

HOW TO APPLY

- Filling up of application forms:-
- (i) Ensure that the DEA proforms is duly filled in and is complete in all respects. Without this proforms, applications will not be entertained.
- (ii) Ensure that the application form prescribed by the sponsoring agency is also complete in all respects. Wherever the sponsoring agency asks for Country Report, the same should also be attached.
- (iii) The column relating to Vigilance Clearance in DEA proforms should be filled in and certified by the competent authority. Alternately, vigilance clearance certificate by the concerned authority can also be attached. Applications without vigilance clearance at the time of applying will not be entertained.
- (iv) In case of training programmes which are not fully sponsored and where expenses on Air travel or any other expenses have to be borne by the candidate or his sponsoring Department, ensure that Part-A or Part-B, as the case may be, of the Undertaking Form is duly completed. Applications received without undertaking form will be summarily rejected. It may be noted that submission of undertaking form is not necessary in respect of fully funded training programmes and the candidate can mention 'Not Applicable' in the form.

4. Nominations:-

- (i) In case there is more than one nomination for a particular course, the nominating authority State/Cenral Government should clearly indicate the prioritization of the nominees.
- (ii) Application for the training programme is to be forwarded through the concerned Ministry/Department after completing all necessary formalities. Applications are not to be sent to the spensoring foreign country/ agency direct unless the same has been endorsed by the Nodal Department i.e. DEA.

5. Clearances:-

Once the nomination forwarded by DEA to the sponsoring foreign Government is accepted and conveyed to the applicant, he/she will be responsible to complete all pre-departure formalities like obtaining political clearance from MEA and have the sanction order issued from his/her administrative Department etc.
