Sir,

Kindly refer to this Ministry's DO letters dated 15.12.2021 and 20.04.2022 (copies enclosed for ready reference) on the subject cited above inviting nominations of IPS officers for filling up the vacancies at various levels i.e. from Superintendent of Police to Director General on Central Deputation.

2. It is to reiterate here that it has been observed that there have not been sufficient nominations of IPS officers for deputation till date from your cadre for filling up vacancies at different levels especially from Superintendent of Police to Inspector General in Central Police Organization (CPOs) and Central Armed Police Forces (CAPFs).

3. It is further observed that a few IPS officers have submitted their applications/nomination on the 'online' portal i.e. <http://ipsdeputation.mha.gov.in> for central deputation. However, the same are not being processed/forwarded electronically by the nodal officer/cadre controlling authority/State Govt. to this Ministry. This results in considerable delay in placement of officers at the Centre.

4. Accordingly, it has been desired to request you to forward sufficient nominations of IPS officers especially at the level of Superintendent of Police to Inspector General to this Ministry at the earliest to enable us to fill up the vacant posts earmarked for IPS officers at centre and every eligible IPS officer gets an opportunity to serve at the centre.

Kindly refer to my earlier DO letter No. I-21023/28/2021-IPS.III dated 15.12.2021 (copy enclosed) inviting nominations of IPS officers for filling up the vacancies at various levels, i.e. from Superintendent of Police to Director General on Central Deputation.

2. In the above context, it is to reiterate here that there have not been sufficient nominations of IPS officers for deputation till date from your State for filling up the vacancies at different levels especially from Superintendent of Police to Inspector General in various Central Police Organizations (CPOs) and Central Armed Police Forces (CAPFs).

3. It is further observed that a few IPS officers have submitted their applications/nominations on the 'online' portal i.e. <http://ipsdeputation.mha.gov.in> for central deputation. However, the same are not being processed/ forwarded electronically by the nodal officer/cadre controlling authority/State Govt. to this Ministry.

4. For proper cadre management, I request you to look into the matter personally and provide sufficient nominations of IPS officers at different levels to this Ministry at the earliest to enable this Ministry to fill up the vacant posts earmarked for IPS officers at Centre so that every eligible officer gets an opportunity to serve at the Centre. It is also reiterated to nominate a suitable nodal officer for the purpose as already stipulated in this Ministry's D.O. letter under reference.

The Ministry of Home Affairs invites nominations of IPS officers for Central deputation every year from various States/Cadres for filling up the vacancies at various levels, i.e. from Superintendent of Police to Director General.

2. For the year 2022 you are requested to send the nominations for the purpose. The detailed guidelines for drawing up the list of the officers, as given in Annexure-I, may please be strictly adhered to while forwarding the names of IPS officers for Central Deputation.

3. It is needless to mention that 40% of Senior Duty Posts in each cadre are earmarked as Central Deputation Reserve (CDR) posts. The Central Deputation Reserve (CDR) of each IPS cadre determines the extent to which the number of officers could be sent on deputation to Government of India. However, it has been the experience that the offer list of some States do not contain sufficient number of names vis-a-vis CDR utilization. Hence, States need to sponsor adequate number of officers so that posts reserved for IPS officers in CAPFs and CPOs are manned by them.

4. From the point of view of proper cadre management, it is necessary to ensure a satisfactory utilization of CDR by movement of officers from the States to the Centre. It would, therefore, be appropriate if a conscious attempt is made by the State Governments to forward the names of officers for deputation under the Government of India in such a manner that, as far as possible, every eligible officer gets an opportunity to serve at the Centre at least once at the middle level and again at the senior level.

5. While sponsoring officers, care may be taken to ensure that officers of different levels/ranks are adequately and proportionately represented. It is necessary to ensure that names of sufficient number of officers are made available on offer at various levels for Central Deputation.

6. A detailed exercise is undertaken before an officer is selected for a post under the Central Government. Very often it is seen that the State Governments withdraw the name of the officer(s) from offer subsequent to their selection to a post or do not relieve them for taking up the assignment at the Centre consequent upon their selection. This results in considerable delay in placement of officers at the Centre and adversely impacts the entire process of selection, deputation and cadre management.

7. The Government of India have been following the policy of debarring officers from Central Deputation for five years if any officer, on being selected, does not join within one month of issue of his/her appointment order, either on account of personal disinclination or on refusal by the concerned State Government to relieve the officer.

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Therefore, it may be ensured that an officer, once placed on the offer list, continues to be available for consideration throughout the year and his name should not be withdrawn during this period barring in exceptional circumstances, and even in such an event, an intimation of change in the availability status of the officer should be given at the earliest opportunity and definitely before his selection.

8. Those officers who have not completed the required "cooling off" period in the cadre may not be included in the offer list till completion of the 'cooling off' period.

9. For processing the request of Central deputation, MHA has launched "online portal" (<http://ipsdeputation.mha.gov.in>) for managing the complete process of forwarding nomination of eligible IPS officers to this Ministry for Central deputation. It is observed that a few IPS officers have submitted their applications/nominations on this portal for approval of the competent authority. However, the same are not being processed/forwarded by the Cadre Controlling Authorities/State Governments to this Ministry. We have not received a single nomination from States/UTs via this portal as the State Governments/UTs administration are sending nominations of IPS officers through physical papers. 10. Only those applications that have been validated electronically by the Nodal Officers will be accepted. All the Nodal Officers may be requested to ensure that details in Annexure-I to IV are duly filled in and complete in all respect. In case of change of the existing Nodal Officer, details along with e-mail I.D. of the Nodal Officer may be intimated to this Ministry and the same must be uploaded online in SUPREMO in prescribed format.

11. We presume your concurrence in operating the 'Offer List' of 2022 till 31.03.2023. The details of this letter are also being placed on this Ministry's website.

12. I would request you to forward the names on priority basis keeping in view the above mentioned requirements.
